



Frequently Asked Questions

1. Where will the park be located?

The park is being built on the North edge of the parking lot at Two Rivers Activity Center, 1501 5th St NE, Jamestown, ND.

2. Who will own and operate the Splash Park?

It will be part of Two Rivers Activity Center which is owned and operated by Jamestown Parks and Recreation Department.

3. How big is the park?

The park is approximately 77,000 square feet. The water features will encompass 6,500 square feet.

4. What will be included at the park?

The park will contain the following;

- Bathhouse- Admission, concession, staff room, restrooms, changing rooms, showers, lockers, and mechanical room
- Splash Pad- Three activity stations to include four slides, Sky Soaker, Discovery Stream, Spray Tunnel, Spinners, Shooters, Puddles, Soakers, Fun-brella, Waterfall, Spiral Tunnel, Spin-a-roo, Misty Twisty, and ground sprays.
- Shade shelters- Three shelters
- Sand volleyball courts- Three courts
- Multipurpose court- Basketball and pickleball
- Bocce Fields
- Green space- open grass space which can be used for a variety of activities such as frisbee, yard games, etc...

5. What is the projected construction cost?

Three million dollars.

6. How is the project funded?

The cost of construction will be funded by private donations and grant funding. Operation costs will be supported by Jamestown Parks and Recreation general fund.

7. What are the anticipated operational costs of the Splash Park?

For 80 days of operation the anticipated operational costs are approximately \$30,000.

8. Is a pool included in the Splash Park?

No, not at this time. Land is designated for a pool in the future. The site plan and bath house have been designed to efficiently be expanded to include a pool.

9. Why is the splash pad being constructed before a pool?

After review of project costs, it was determined that a splash pad is less expensive to build and maintain over time than a pool. In addition, a splash pad allows for more days of operation into early Spring and late Summer.

10. When will a pool be added to the Splash Park?

At this point there is no time frame for the addition of a pool. The site is designed to include a pool when costs and available funding align.

11. Will admission be charged to visit the Splash Park?

A small admission charge will be assessed to those that enter the gates of the splash deck area. This admission will be included in TRAC membership but non members will be able to purchase a day pass or season pass to use the splash deck. The courts and green space will not have an admission fee.

12. Will there be shade shelters available to rent?

Yes, there will be three shelters available to reserve and rent. When not rented the shelters will be available for guest use on a first come-first serve basis.

13. Will the splash pad use a flow through or recirculating system?

The water will be filtered using a similar recirculating system to the indoor pools at TRAC.

14. Will the Splash Park be staffed?

Yes, the Splash Park will have staff working the admission/concession area and during peak times supervisors/life guards will be on duty to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for guests. JPRD and TRAC staff will be responsible for facility maintenance and cleaning.

15. When will construction begin?

Construction began in August 2020.

16. When will the Splash Park be open for use?

The anticipated construction completion is Spring 2021. An official Grand Opening will be scheduled at that time.
